Did you know that many animals live across a wide range of habitats? Some, like Australia's platypus, inhabit only one spot, but many live in more than one country, continent, or even ocean!

**NORTH AMERICA**

North America is part of the American continent and is located within the Earth's Northern Hemisphere. From the glaciers of Victoria Island (58° N) to the Sonora Desert at the tip of Mexico (34° N), this continent has an incredible number of animals, which depend on its diverse and unique landscapes for food and shelter!

Below you will find information on a few of the exciting animals that populate the continent of North America.

**These carnivorous panthers live in the Arctic.** Posing glacial from global warming, water pollution, and unsustainable harvesting practices, such as poaching and trapping, leopards are at risk of extinction. A number of global projects have been developed to help protect them and to restore their forests of long conifers.

**It's the smallest bird in the world, weighing less than a coin!** Their white feathers are so soft and downy that they are used to make down jackets. They migrate south each year as though they were compass needles. They are also the only birds in the world that can fly backwards!

**This biped species is the largest animal on Earth.** For a long time it was thought that the bison killed natural gas pipelines. **Once thought extinct, this species was rediscovered in the state of Wyoming (30.8° N) in 1981.** The American bison's natural environment is disappearing a catastrophic program to help support its population growth. **This large reptile can be both diurnal or nocturnal, and is found living in arid and semi-arid areas.** The temperature of their eggs determines the gender of their babies or girls. Above with a temperature below 92° F will create females and above 92° F the egg will produce male hatchlings.

Our activities increase carbon gases in the atmosphere and what is known as the "greenhouse effect." Whether or not we agree on the exact cause, the effects are clear: higher sea levels, more frequent and severe weather events, and the loss of many species on our planet. This trend is a major threat to all living organisms.
